(Act No. 27 of 2010)

**The Animal Health (Control and Prevention of Animal
Disease) Order, 2014**

IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in section *eighty* of the Animal Health Act, 2010, the following Order is hereby made:

1. This Order may be cited as the Animal Health (Control and Prevention of Animal Disease) Order, 2014. Title
2. (1) An owner of an animal shall vaccinate the animal against the diseases in the areas specified in the Schedule. Mandatory vaccination
(2) A veterinary assistant shall, where an animal is vaccinated in accordance with this Order, enter the vaccination dates and farmer cards into the stock register.
(3) An owner of a vaccinated animal shall give a veterinary assistant the used vaccine vials for verification and disposal.
(4) A vaccinating veterinarian shall issue a vaccination certificate for African Horse sickness and Rabies to an owner of an animal vaccinated against African Horse sickness and Rabies.

Foot and Mouth Disease	Kazungula, Livingstone, Namwala, Itezhi-tezhi, Monze North, Mazabuka, Mumwa South, Mwandu, Mulobezi and Mbala
Lumpy skin disease	the entire Zambia

African Horse sickness	the entire Zambia
<i>Dogs/Cats</i>	
Rabies	the entire Zambia

2. SCHEDULE OF VACCINATION

<i>Cattle</i>	
Anthrax	annually between the months April and June
Black leg	annually between the months April and June
Haemorrhagic Septicaemia	annually between the months April and June
Contagious bovine pleuro-pneumonia (CBPP)	annually between the months July and August (Veterinarians only)
Foot and Mouth Disease	bi annual, May/June and September/October (Veterinarians only)
Lumpy skin disease	once, at the age of six to seven months
<i>Horses</i>	
African Horse sickness	two vaccinations three weeks apart for foals six months of age followed by boosters at intervals not exceeding twelve months (Veterinarians only)
<i>Poultry, excluding broiler, layers and parent stock schedules</i>	
Newcastle disease	day one for all day old chicks biannual, March/April and September/October for village chickens

Dogs/cats

Rabies

at the ages of three months, nine months and then at intervals not exceeding twelve months
